The cutting scores have to be interpreted this way:

- For a given scale, if the child's score is over or equal to the cutting score, it means it is over or equal to the 70th percentile of the distibution of the provencial representative sample.
- The cutting scores vary depending on the child's sex and age.

For exemple:

Agressivity, 13 items – boy- 6 years old

If a boy in kindergarten has a score of 6 or more on the SBQ-T agressivity scale, it means he is over the 70th percentile on the scale, so, he is part of the 30% most agressive child.
